
## Celebrating Diversity

A story everyone can relate to! This story is a visually unique way of communicating positive ideas about inclusion and diversity.




# Worry and Anxiety

An aspirational story about a child with big ambitions who wants to be an astronaut one day. This book celebrates a main character from an ethnic minority group.



## Current Challenges in Society


A story that captures the emotions of struggle, resilience and hope articulating with dignity, an experience which a child may have.
